Walhalla, originally called Stringer's Creek (named after the man who first discovered gold there) was a bustling goldmining town established in the 1860s. The pioneers dubbed it as Australia's version of Switzerland when snow gracefully fell upon the town and made it look like a postcard. It is now a cherished icon of how pioneers lived, worked and enjoyed life. The perfect getaway for those who want to 'get away from it all' and recharge with glorious views and mountains all around as a backdrop.

This town prides itself on maintaining their heritage and offers visitors the opportunity to see authentic original homes and buildings of the early days. Many of those buildings are open to the public and some are B&B accommodation.

There is plenty to do for day trips or longer stays and Walhalla was listed as one of the top five places to visit in Victoria. Immerse yourself in history while having fun with the gold mine tour as it takes visitors into the Long Tunnel Extended Mine. Ride the Walhalla to Thomson Station railway and be amazed at the scenery. Join the ghost tour as it winds around the town and learn about the many ghostly sightings. Climb the cemetery's steep mountain where tombstones and nature are entwined, or take one of the many bushwalking tracks and see what you discover.
